



# Can photovoltaic panels be washed with water to remove snow

Should I remove snow from my solar panels?

There's little reason to remove snow from panels. Some sunlight will penetrate even thick snow, and the heat generated by the panels as they produce electricity will melt the snow relatively quickly. The tilt of most panels is steep enough that the snow will just slide off (and do the washing for you). Ground-mounted solar panels are easy to clean.

How to clean solar panels?

Starting with a gentle brushing is the best way to clean solar panels because if a lot of material is sitting on solar panels, immediately mixing the debris with water might cause spread and smear. Brushing breaks down and removes some material, making the next steps in the cleaning process more effective.

How much does solar panel cleaning cost?

Companies typically charge \$5 to \$15 per panel for solar panel cleaning services. Not cleaning your solar panels can lower your solar savings by \$79 per year, on average. You can clean solar panels yourself in a few simple steps or seek out a cleaning company that can do it for you.

Who is responsible for removing snow from solar panels?

If you are a member of a community solar farm on a monthly (or annual) subscription plan, the owner of the panels is responsible for cleaning them. Check your subscription plan to see if periodic cleaning is included. If it's not, ask before you sign. Snow will melt. There's little reason to remove snow from panels.

While a blanket of snow might affect the energy output of a solar panel (because it can't generate energy if no sunlight reaches the panel), it's rarely a factor. Solar panels are usually mounted ...

Use water only, unless you have hard-to-remove debris on your panels, such as bird droppings. Use a simple garden hose. A high-pressure sprayer could damage your panels.
