There are very few plants that your geese and ducks won't eat, in particular they enjoy new growth, but some plants stand up to waterfowl better than others once well established.

Can ducks eat free floating plants?

Submerged plants and free floating plants will only survive if your waterfowl stocking density is very low. These will encourage invertebrates and provide an important source of food for diving ducks. By serving as oxygenators, they can also help improve water quality and the health of the pond.

On average, healthy grass is about 35% fiber and 16% protein with trace minerals and nutrients including calcium, magnesium, zinc, selenium, folic acid, Vitamin A, and manganese.
