Are solar panels a scam?

With that demand comes fierce competition within the solar panel market. Scams, schemes and straight-up fraud abound in the dark underbelly of an otherwise light-filled industry. While there are still many honest and reliable solar panel companies on the market, it can be hard to differentiate the good guys from the rest.

Are 'fake' solar companies a scam?

Beware of any company asking you to make a big deposit before they have completed their installation. This is one of the most common ways 'fake' solar companies have targeted consumers - whereby they take a hefty deposit and then never turn up to carry out the installation. This is common solar scam.

Are solar panels being targeted by fraudsters using feed-in tariffs?

Households that have already installed solar panels are also being targeted by fraudsters using publicly available information from feed-in tariffs, warned Dr Tim Jones, of Cornwall-based charity Community Energy Plus.

Is my solar panel installer going out of business?

If you're not sure whether your solar panel installer has gone out of business, and a cold caller is insisting they are taking over, don't take their word for it. In this instance, it turned out to be a scam. Instead, check your original installer's website and try the contact details you were given when your panels were installed.

Are You at risk of a misleading solar panel scheme?

Thousands of households are at risk of falling victim to misleading solar panel schemes which are up by 50 per cent over the last year, data from Action Fraud reveals.

Do you have a problem with your solar panel?

In fact, solar panel problems are quite rare: nearly seven in 10 owners in our survey told us they had never had a technical problem with their solar PV system. Your solar panel installer should have told you how to check that your system is working correctly, and any maintenance you might need over the years.

Solar panel owners are most likely to be approached about solar panel servicing, according to our survey, followed by voltage optimisers, replacement inverters and solar buyback. Have you been approached with these solar panel products or services? 36% have been offered a solar panel service e.g. to check their system is running correctly

When we shared these with solar panel trade association Solar Energy UK, it warned that these could be dubious reasons that a cold-calling company may use to try to mis-sell to homeowners. It's very unlikely that a company would be able to monitor your solar panels remotely, nor tell without knowledge of your system whether it presents any safety risk.

Customers of Vivint Solar, for instance, complained to the California Attorney General about the company's false promises and misleading sales offers. One reported being promised savings of 20-30 percent on their electric bill, but after solar panels were installed, the bill actually increased by 80 percent ...

Fake solar panel emails. Action Fraud has warned of phishing emails pretending to offer you deals on solar panels. The emails ask you to check your eligibility for funding to cover the upfront costs of solar panel installation and prompt you to follow a link. The link asks for personal and financial information, and may install malware on your ...

We've heard numerous reports of scam emails and websites offering cheap solar panel installation and free health checks, so do be careful. It's important you do your research and use a reputable company before getting solar panels fitted and once you've got them, don't fall for ads trying to sell you solar panel servicing or cleaning.

One of the biggest pros of springing for a solar panel installation is the tax credits, and that's no scam. For solar panels installed between 2020 and 2022, the federal Investment Tax Credit sits at a very attractive 26% --

Research Contractors: Before entering into a solar panel installation agreement, research the contractor's reputation and check for reviews and complaints. Review Financing Documents Carefully: Read and review all financing documents carefully, and ensure they accurately reflect the terms and costs of the installation. Document Everything: Keep records ...

Beware of solar panel scams: Con artists use misleading tactics to trick homeowners out of money and personal information. ... Or, they may install the panels but do a poor job, resulting in panels that don't work. If you reach out to the scammer to finish the job or fix the panels, they will become unreachable and disappear with your money ...

Unfortunately in the UK, forceful, aggressive, or dishonest sales tactics are all too common in most contracting fields, including "Free" solar panel installations. Fraudulent companies will try ...
